From Dave's Desk...

Without getting political, allow me to say that America is a troubled nation, with plenty of problems. Growing debt (both nationally & personally), immigration issues, violence, pornography; the list is seemingly endless. One of our most widespread, yet I believe underaddressed, problems is drugs – especially the abuse of prescription drugs. Opioid addiction is a major contributor to crime, broken families, disability claims & lost production.

As with all of our society's ills, we can react in one of 3 ways: we can close our eyes, turn our heads & pretend the problem is not really a problem – after all, "it doesn't directly affect me"; we can shrug our shoulders & resign ourselves to "that's just the way things are"; OR we can educate ourselves & work together – as a church – to address the issue, at least locally. Beginning September 29, I am going to begin a sermon series entitled "What If?" It is based on an initiative of the West Virginia Annual Conference, which has been ravaged by the opioid epidemic. (Much like Davidson County!) For 7 weeks, I am asking all of us here at Shiloh to take 4 steps each week: Fast. Pray. Listen. Respond.

Fast. What if we skipped a meal one day a week & stopped to pray for those feeling the pang of addiction?

Pray. What if we intentionally asked God to show us how to respond to those in addiction? **Listen.** What if, during this series, we stop & listen for God's guidance in responding to those in addiction?

Respond. We are all called. We all have gifts & grace. Is the problem too big for us? Yes! Is the problem too big for God? Absolutely not!

I know God is calling us – all of Shiloh UMC – to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Can we imagine (& work for) a world without an opioid epidemic?

I'll see you at the "transforming" place on Sunday! Dave
