



Vacation Bible School



Birth Announcement

On May 13th, the District Disaster Rebuild Team started work on a job unlike any they had tackled before —laying brick underpinning under a mobile home! A widow who lives on Old Salisbury Road had hired someone quite a while ago to underpin her large mobile home with brick. They started the job but only did less than half of it. She had been unsuccessful in finding anyone to finish the job, largely due to the difficulty of the job. The disaster team agreed to take the job on. Seven men were on hand that morning to begin work; which involved detaching and moving a wooden porch, railing, & steps unit away from the home for access; mixing mortar; wheelbarrowing mortar; wheelbarrowing brick; spreading mortar; laying brick; and striping the mortar joints. The willing, but weary, workers finished up for the day after about 5 hours of hard work. The crew returned a few mornings later and finished up the job around lunchtime on that day.

On May 17th, members of the team met at Shiloh for the first formal business meeting of the team since COVID19 restrictions were imposed in early 2020.

On May 26th, about ten men met at a home in the Holly Grove community to remove an old wooden handicapped ramp and install a new aluminum one for use by the homeowner's wheelchair-bound son. The old ramp was torn away and placed on the ground and then the aluminum ramp sections were carried from a flatbed trailer to the front door, assembled, and secured to the home and ground. The old ramp was then placed on the trailer for later disposal at Todco. The group then moved a few miles west on East Holly Grove Road and installed a wooden handicapped ramp on a home. The disassembled wooden ramp from the first job was then taken to Todco. All of this work was completed in a little over three hours. The prep work that team leader Odell Miller had done prior to the morning's work was, of course, a tremendous head start.

God is good......all the time!
