From Dave's Desk...

About 1500 funeral directors attend the Death Care World Expo each year. Of course, in 2020 it had to be held virtually. Each year they learn about new concepts for funerals as requested by the loved ones left behind.

This year attendees were told that families are opting for shorter, less costly services (if there is a service at all), eulogies with poems & personal memories, & even post funeral parties (not advised!). Some want to be buried with their pets. Many are choosing environmentally friendly options such as plain pine boxes or cremation.

Celestis Inc, a Houston company in its 20th year, will launch the cremated remains into space. It costs about \$5000 to be sent into earth orbit & \$12,500 to be sent to the moon. The remains are placed in canisters aboard commercial satellite vehicles. The last launch was in January; reservations for the next launch close on June 30.

Nowadays caskets do not have to be cold & gloomy. One company offers caskets with shells & dirt from the deceased's favorite beach or own backyard.

Every single person will discover that the solution to death is not found in the funeral, but in Easter. A comfortable casket will not change our eternal destiny – only our faith in Him who conquered death. Jesus can make a casket a hope chest!

I am glad we celebrate Easter every week as we worship on Sunday. I look forward to a special celebration with you this Sunday. I thank all the people that make our weekly celebration possible – ushering, singing, teaching, keeping the nursery (when possible), running the sound booth & projector, playing instruments. You all make <u>every</u> Sunday memorable!




We plan to celebrate Homecoming this year. The date is May 16. *Rev. Jeff Coppley* will be our guest preacher.
